Words to Stand On

The Word of God Is A Weapon Against Satan

The Word of God is another weapon against Satan. In Ephesians 6:17, Paul refers to the "sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God." "Word" translates the Greek noun *rhēma* (ῥῆμα) which is a specific word that fits the situation. Some of the other passages where "word" translates the Greek noun *rhēma* are Matthew 4:4; Romans 10:17; Ephesians 5:26 (Strong's 4487).

Another Greek noun that is translated "word" is *logos* (λόγος). Think of the logos as the whole Bible or the belt of truth. Think of the sword of the Spirit as specific words that are drawn from the whole Bible or belt of truth or logos. All of the words Jesus use in the wilderness to resist Satan's temptations were *rhēma* words. Jesus used *rhēma* words to resist the temptation to turn the stones into bread (Matthew 4:1-4; cf. Deuteronomy 8:3). Jesus used *rhēma* words to resist the temptation to jump down from the highest point of the Temple (Matthew 4:5-7; cf. Deuteronomy 6:16). Jesus used *rhēma* words to resist the temptation to fall down and worship Satan (Matthew 4:8-10; cf. Deuteronomy 6:13; 10:20). Quoting or reciting Scriptures helps us to resist Satan. Resisting Satan and submitting to God are actions that cause Satan to flee from us (James 4:7).

Let us practice these words: "*Your word I have hidden in my heart, that I might not sin against You*" (Psalm 119:11, NKJV). "*And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God*" (Ephesians 6:17, NKJV).

Let us stand on these words: "*Therefore submit to God. Resist the devil and he will flee from you*" (James 4:7, NKJV).
