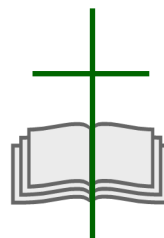

Words to Stand On

God May Arrange Things for His Glory

In order to put His power or glory on display,
God commanded Moses to lead the children of Israel to
an encampment in a dangerous place by the Red Sea
(Exodus 14:1-31).

God said to Pharaoh through Moses that God
raised up Pharaoh to put God's power or glory on dis-
play (Exodus 9:15-18; cf. Romans 9:17; Psalm 75:6-7;
Daniel 4:17).

Gideon had to fight 135,000 Midianites. Gideon
had 32,000 Israelites in his army. God told Gideon that
he had too many men. God reduced Gideon's army to
300 men because God wanted all of the glory for the
victory that He was going to give to Gideon over the
Midianites (Judges 6-8).

Let us remember that God does everything for
His glory, and God usually does what brings Him the
most glory. Let us remember also that God's ways are
not our ways (Isaiah 55:8-9).

Let us stand on these words: *Oh, the depth of the
riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How
unsearchable are His judgments and His ways past
finding out!* (Romans 11:33, NKJV).
